



Labor and Industry Eliminates Walk-in Approvals

As of February 1, 2004 the Bureau of Occupational and Industrial Safety will terminate its long-standing practice of performing plan reviews for “walk-in” customers. The primary reason is to allow plan reviewers to spend time preparing for their new duties in implementing the Uniform Construction Code program and space constraints.

Other plan review procedures will not be altered. Review documents may still be mailed and will be reviewed in the order in which they are received. Design professionals and owners will need to plan ahead for the time lag associated with the elimination of this time saving service.
